

"I have given them the glory that you gave Me, that they may be one as We are one: I in them and You in Me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent Me and have loved them even as you have loved Me."
John 17:22-23

There seems to be two calls for unity in the church today. One, which our Lord prays for during His final days on earth, is being spoken by the Holy Spirit to beautify the church and prepare her for the harvest of souls Jesus died to bring in. The other call to unity is from a different spirit that insists that there is no absolute truth in the realm of religion. We achieve unity, in this call, by letting go of the pride of insisting our way is right, and recognizing that all religions lead to God and are equally valid.

Jesus prayed that His church would be one even as He and the Father are one. He implied that this would be the key to the world believing in Him. Not miracles, not great preaching, not brilliant apologetics, but Christians answering His call to really love each other. The world will believe because they know this love requires God. Unity doesn't come naturally because we are naturally proud, and pride divides.

Pride doesn't seek unity, but uniformity. "To be in our church you have to believe just like us, you have to dress just like us, and it helps if you look and talk just like us." This is not what Jesus died for. The very word unity implies diversity. The church is to bring people together in Christ who would not naturally be together; young and old, black and white, rich and poor, cultured and uncultured, learned and unlearned; the ground is level at the cross.

Jesus states that He has given us His glory to make us one. Understanding this is the key to churches becoming one in Christ even while holding differing positions on various doctrinal issues. There are two kinds of glory in scripture, one that God will not share and one that He wants to share. The one God will not share concerns who gets the credit for the things that get done. God will get all the credit and we will lay down our crowns at His feet. He says, "My glory I will not give to another." (Is. 48:11)

The other glory is the manifestation of His Person, Presence, and Power. As His church beholds this glory in an increased way she is being transformed from glory to glory. (2Cor. 3:18) As we focus on the beauty of Jesus and come into the glory of His Presence all of the smaller things that seem so important to pride take their rightful place. He wants us to get our eyes off of ourselves and on to Him and His desire for us to love one another. Then...the world will believe.
