

Letter to the Community

On behalf of the North Florida Tres Dias Secretariat. After much prayer, discussion, and reflection, we felt it was important to address recent events directly and bring clarity to our community.

Over the past two weeks, there have been some unfortunate events that have created confusion and division in our community. Accusations were made against a member of our community, confidential information was shared inappropriately, and information was presented during the recent Men's team meeting before it had been fully reviewed by the entire Secretariat and before a unified decision had been reached on how to move forward. As a result, confusion spread quickly among team members and throughout the broader community.

Instead, we want to bring clarity.

The accusations made referred to events that took place in 2024. The individual involved had already taken intentional and responsible steps toward accountability more than eight months ago by establishing an accountability team made up of trusted leaders within their church and community. This process was in place well before the recent concerns surfaced.

As a result of how these matters unfolded, changes have been made at the Secretariat table. Andy Fowler has regretfully resigned from his position as Chairman of North Florida Tres Dias. Thank you, Andy, for your years of faithful and honorable service to the Tres Dias community. You are a much loved and appreciated brother. Kristen Bailey, Secretary, is now serving as Interim Chairman until that seat can be formally filled at the table. We are grateful for her willingness to step into this role during a sensitive and important time for our community.

Kyle Moye, Community Spiritual Director, who had previously voluntarily submitted his resignation, was asked to prayerfully consider returning to the table as Community Spiritual Director. However, after much prayer and careful consideration, Kyle has decided not to return to the Secretariat. We respect his decision and remain grateful for the time, leadership, and spiritual investment he has given to North Florida Tres Dias. We also continue to recognize the weight this season has carried for him and his family, and we ask that you join us in covering them in prayer.

At this time, we are prayerfully seeking someone to serve in the interim role of Community Spiritual Director. We are taking intentional time to consider both seat nominations carefully and to seek the Lord's guidance before filling them. Our desire is not to move quickly, but to move prayerfully and wisely.

We acknowledge that this has been painful and unsettling for many. Miscommunication and trust affect all of us. But this is not a moment for division—it is a moment for healing.

North Florida Tres Dias was built on the foundations of grace, forgiveness, accountability, and love—the very things Christ calls us to live out as His followers. Scripture reminds us that we are to bear with one another, forgive as we have been forgiven, speak truth in love, and pursue unity in the bond of peace. What matters now is that we reflect Him well. That we choose humility over pride, grace over accusation, and reconciliation over division. As we move forward, our eyes must remain fixed on God—not on circumstances—and on serving the candidates He entrusts to us with hearts that honor Him in the way we treat one another.

As a Secretariat, we are committed to moving forward with transparency, humility, and prayer. We are committed to protecting the integrity of this ministry. And we are committed to walking through this season together—not as divided individuals, but as one body.

This is a time of healing for our community. It is our prayer that we will now move forward with grace, with clarity, and with hearts ready to serve.

Our candidates receive a lot of information from the Rollistas, but half of what they get on the weekend is from what I call "non-verbal communication." That's the communication you get from just being there. Like when the Rector gives the rollista a cross and a hug. No one said anything, but everyone knows something just took place. The rector's anointing temporarily transferred to the Rollista. Likewise, when the Rollista dresses up for his talk, it sends the message that what he is going to say is important. Back on weekend #37, the first non-verbal communication I got was, "these CHA guys actually love each other!" At that time in my Christian walk that was a new concept. It is my fervent prayer that the candidates on weekend #71 say, "You know what, these CHA guys really love each other!" Let's make it happen.






GREETINGS AND SALUTATIONS!




