1. Financial Report, Sean Nyberg, Treasurer

She said there was a lot of food carried over for the October weekend. Before the October weekend, Carrie said the can opener that belongs to the campground needs to be replaced if possible.
- Newsletter Couple - Aaron let everyone know that all newsletters were submitted.
- Weekend Couple - Deanna said Doug told her the campground looked good. A master key was kept and will be returned. It was suggested that the master key needs to only be held by the Weekend and Procurement Couple to avoid any other issues. It was decided that the discussion of only having one, no more than two, people check out the master key. This will be discussed further at the May meeting. Becky suggested the paper towel key also be put on the master key ring.
- Community Spiritual - Kyle said he has been praying on how to get more pastors involved in order to have more diversity. He will speak with pastors of churches that have members that attend Tres Dias to see if they might want to go through on a weekend. He thinks it would be a great idea for the pastors to attend.
- Pescadore Coordinator - Becky said had to do a few PO training sessions before the weekend. The video that was awesome. However, it was too big to attach to email to team members. The process included Becky sending the team member an email requiring the team member to read the PO Manual located on the NFTD website.
